

One who was, is, and is to come, and



A Word of Thanks from the Editor.

As we step into this new year, full of new opportunities for improving the world around us, let's take a moment and look back on 2024... in Gratitude!

For the benefits of Gratitude, I'm quoting excerpts of the most recent publication by the John Templeton Foundation - food for thought for one great year - and beyond!

The Roman politician and orator Cicero famously called gratitude "not only the greatest of the virtues but the parent of all the others." ... Throughout history and around the world, religious leaders and philosophers have extolled the virtue of gratitude. Some have even described gratitude as "social glue" that fortifies relationships - between friends, family, and romantic partners - and serves as the backbone of human society.

Whether one finds oneself on the giving or the receiving end, there is something undeniably compelling about gratitude. Over the past decade researchers ... and hundreds of others have published studies looking at the nature of gratitude, how we might cultivate it, and what effects that cultivation might have. Gratitude has been shown to be correlated with many other positive physical and psychological outcomes... a handful of studies suggest that more grateful people may be healthier, and others suggest that scientifically designed practices to increase gratitude can also improve health and encourage the adoption of healthier habits. ...

Gratitude may also benefit people with various medical and psychological challenges. For example, one study found that more grateful cardiac patients reported better sleep, less fatigue, and lower levels of cellular inflammation, while another found that heart failure patients who kept a gratitude journal for eight weeks were more grateful and had reduced signs of inflammation afterwards. Several studies have found that more grateful people experience less depression and are more resilient following traumatic events.


Multiple studies have also found that people with higher levels of dispositional gratitude have signs of better psychological health, including higher levels of perceived social support and lower levels of stress, depression, and anxiety. ...

Since evidence links gratitude to a host of psychological benefits, it stands to reason that activities encouraging people to feel more grateful might produce similar benefits. ... In one study, people who wrote about their blessings weekly for 10 weeks reported feeling more optimistic about the following week; they also felt better about their overall lives than did participants who wrote about daily hassles or ordinary events in their lives. In another study, people who wrote down three things that went well, and identified the causes of those good things, reported increased happiness six months after the week-long intervention. ...

In recent years, studies have found that more grateful adolescents are more interested and satisfied with their school lives, are more kind and helpful, and are more socially integrated.

... A handful of studies suggest that gratitude may help employees perform their jobs more effectively, feel more satisfied at work, and act more helpfully and respectfully toward their coworkers.

Solar Power Task Force Update

The Solar Power Task Force continues to make progress towards the goal of having a solar power array here at Wyoming Church. In November the team received two updated proposals with a third proposal promised by shortly after Thanksgiving. We also received bad news concerning a roof mounted solar array. The structural engineer who looked at our blueprints of the roof felt the roof did not have the reserve capacity for for solar panels without reinforcement. An architect who was also involved with the assessment of the roof said that such reinforcement would have significant cost.

The task force team met on December 11th along with Trustees to discuss the updated proposals and report from the structural engineer and architect. The Solar Power task Force team voted to recommend a ground mount proposal from Paradise Energy Solutions. The Trustees then voted to recommend adoption of the proposal to Executive Team.

On Sunday, December 15th, after a presentation of the proposal, the Executive Team voted to move the proposal forward to the entire church for a vote on acceptance or not. The church vote is scheduled for Monday, January 13, at 6:30 PM.

Now some facts and figures. The total cost for the project is \$278,300. This represents about 2/3 of our total free cost, which we would pay in total by the end of the installation of the

project. However, we would receive an incentive from Delmarva Power of \$35,000 within a few months of completion of the project. We also will receive a credit from the federal government for \$83,400 although we will not receive that until sometime in 2026.

These two incentives will bring the net cost of installation for us down to \$159,810. Then there is the savings that will we will save on our electric use. Our year one electric savings is estimated at \$11,050. If the average annual electric rate of inflation is 1%, by year 30 we will have saved \$355,149. If the rate of inflation is 3%, our savings will be \$481,949. When

compared to our net installation cost, the church will be saving somewhere from \$170,000 to \$320,000 over 30 years.

Finally, this solar power project helps us contribute in at least a small way to helping fight climate change. By doing this project, we will offset 98.2 tons of CO2 a year. We are also sending a message to our community and United Methodist Conference that we care about this world The Lord has given us and the people in it.

Once again, the task force would like you to know it is pleased to have this opportunity to do our part in helping to take care this beautiful world The Lord has given us while saving the church a great deal of money.



In the course of two years, we have collected over 3,000 lbs (three thousand pounds) of plastic, in other words:

we have **three** Trex benches now!
With undiminished efforts we move on to the next one. Keep those plastic bags, envelopes, and bubble wrap coming!

Remember, **NO** bottles or hard plastic. Thank you for keeping all that plastic out of the landfills, too!



Grounds Noteworthy Plantings.

As the years roll by at our Wyoming United Methodist Church's current site we sometimes tend to take for granted some of the subtle changes that occur in the plantings that help to make our location the attraction that it is.

For example, the landscaped bed to the right of the South Entrance is themed with varieties of Burning Bush and a Fig shrub --- both meant to evoke links to the Holy Land. Please note that the Fig is about to undergo a long-promised trim and/or a transplant to a more favorable site on the grounds.

At the East end of the South Parking Lot are three flourishing plantings of which two are Oaks that are native to the Delmarva Peninsula. However, the third planting is 'far from home'! This third planting is a Deodar Cedar which is native to the Himalayas and is genetically related to the famed Cedars of Lebanon. Finally, whenever you exit left from the South Parking Lot heading towards Wyoming, a QUICK glance to your left near our south property boundary will reveal a young Loblolly Pine that has been designated a Sentinel Pine for the Church.


